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IMPORTANT UPDATES ON COVID-19

Testing and Clearance

The Ministry of Health has released an update to the <u>COVID-19 Quick Reference Public Health</u> <u>Guidance on Testing and Clearance</u> / <u>French Version</u> (V. 10.0 October 1, 2020)

Significant change includes:

- Moving from a 14-day clearance period for all cases, to a 10-day clearance period for the majority of cases with mild to moderate illness and a 20-day clearance period for cases with severe illness (requiring ICU-level support) or with immune compromise.
- Contacts who have had a high-risk exposure to a case must self-isolate for 14 days from their last exposure.
- As indicated several weeks ago, an asymptomatic individual that has previously had laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 AND was cleared, should generally not be re-tested due to persistent shedding.

Schools and Childcare Self-Assessment tool

The Ministry of Health has released an update to the <u>COVID-19 Screening Tool for Children in School and Child Care</u> / <u>French Version</u> (**V. 1.0 October 1, 2020**). This tool is now applicable to Child Care settings.

The major change is the update now separates symptoms into 2 categories.

Please note that this updated tool only applies to children attending school or daycare settings, all other people should continue to use the Ministry's COVID-19 Screening tool. This is creating the scenario where a teenager with a single symptom can pass the school self-assessment tool but fail the general population tool. In this situation, the teenager can attend school but cannot attend work. The Ministry is aware of this discrepancy.
