June 4 Community Bike Festival: get a free bike! May 24, 2021 - For immediate release

Bike Month 2022 is kicking off with the Community Bike Festival, an event created to help everyone have a bike to ride this summer. Dozens of bicycles of various sizes have been donated by community members. Volunteers have checked each bike and repaired them to be safe and road-ready. Donated bikes are now ready for new homes and will be given out on a first-come-first-served basis. All bikes are free—there is no need to give a bike to receive a bike

The festival will take place at the New Liskeard Agricultural Research Station on Saturday, June 4 from 11:00 am – 1:00 pm, with registration starting at 10:30 am. In case of bad weather, the festival will be postponed to Saturday, June 11 at the Haileybury Harbourfront Pavilion.

"Riding a bike is a fun and affordable way to get around. It's good for our physical and mental health, and it's an environmentally friendly travel choice." says festival coordinator Erika Aelterman. "Many of the bikes we receive are in great condition and we have some available for the whole family.

In addition to the bike giveaways, the festival will have a bike decorating station, a mini bike rodeo, helmet fit station, and a smoothie bike for folks to try. Centre de santé communautaire du Temiskaming will give adults an opportunity to try a tricycle that is available for loan throughout the district. Lunch will be available with a charity BBQ benefitting Jumpstart.

This community event is made possible through the help of fantastic volunteers, many of which you have likely seen riding around Temiskaming Shores, as well as several community partners including Timiskaming District Secondary School, Timiskaming Health Unit, City of Temiskaming Shores, New Liskeard Property Corp, Centre de sante communautaire du Timiskaming, and RE/MAX Pursuit Realty. The Bike Festival has also benefitted from a generous donation from 100 Women Who Care.

The Bike Exchange is one of many Bike Month initiatives being promoted by Temiskaming Shores' Bicycle Friendly Community Committee, which works to make Temiskaming Shores a great place to walk and cycle. "The City of Temiskaming Shores is a proud partner of the upcoming Community Bike Exchange." says Mathew Bahm, Director of Recreation. "This will be the third year that the bike exchange committee has run this event, and so far, the initiative has given away close to 125 bicycles!"
